# The 25<sup>th</sup> Annual International Latino Book Awards Recognized A Record Number of Books By Kirk Whisler

On October 21, 2023 Empowering Latino Futures recognized a record number of authors and books at the 25<sup>th</sup> International Latino Book Awards. Attending the Awards were over 135 winning authors, along with publishers, illustrators, translators, and other publishing professionals. Finally after decades of growth books by and about Latinos are getting more of the attention they deserve. That's a key goal of Empowering Latino Futures and these Awards. Special awards are named after: Alma Flor Ada, Isabel Allende, Rudolfo Anaya, Charlie Eriksen, Juan Felipe Herrera, Dolores Huerta, Hank Lacayo, Mimi Lozano, Ambassador Julian Nava, Victor Villaseñor, and Raul Yzaguirre. Four key ways the marketplace for books for, by and about Latinos is evolving:

- 1. MORE BOOKS. This year Empowering Latino Futures received a 19 percent increase in entries over the previous record high. This is another sign of the GREAT quality of books for, by and about Latinos that are being produced. This year's 221 judges were a tremendous help in this process. These professors, librarians, educators, journalists, members of REFORMA and Las Comadres, and people who love and appreciate good books were busy reviewing all the entries.
- 2. MORE READERS. A further sign is that there is now a consistent audience for books in both Spanish and English with a sizeable audience of 15.5 million Latino readers across the United States. These consistent readers represent 34 percent of all Latino adults and have a combined income of \$452 billion. The National Latino Reader Study's nationwide survey of 10,640 found that these readers purchase an average of 24.7 books a year, with 42 percent of the books in Spanish, a major increase from a few decades ago when it was much harder to find a wide variety of books in Spanish in the United States.
- 3. MAJOR PUBLISHERS. Another key indicator is that major publishers are paying more attention to up-and-coming Latino authors than they ever have. These publishers have seen the growing audience for their books and are beginning to better understand how to market to the Latino community.
- 4. QUALITY INCREASING. Empowering Latino Futures takes very meaningfully the responsibility that it has being created by and about Latinos AND in the quality of those books. That is why in addition to recognizing the greatness of these Award-Winning Books, Honorable Mention books are also celebrated. All these are books are also worth reading and enjoying.

Since its founding in 1997 Empowering Latino Futures has held 71 Latino Book & Family Festivals around the USA with our Latino Book & Family Festivals; Served 182,500 youth with our National Latino & American Indian Scholarship Directory; Honored over 3,000 books with the Int'l Latino Book Awards; provided 208,000 books to underserved youth with Education Begins in the Home, which started in 2015; and our Latino Books into Movies Awards that has honored 199 books and scripts. By the way, we will hold our 72nd Latino Book & Family Festival at Sacramento City College on November 4th with Dolores Huerta as the keynote.

Cuatro maneras en que el mercado de los libros para, por y sobre los latinos está evolucionado:

- 1. MÁS LIBROS. Este año Empowering Latino Futures vio un aumento del 19 por ciento en inscripciones comparado con el récord anterior. Es otra señal de la GRAN calidad de los libros que se están publicando para, por y sobre los latinos. Los jueces este año fueron una ayuda indispensable en este proceso. Estos profesores, bibliotecarios, educadores, periodistas, miembros de REFORMA y Las Comadres y quienes que aman y aprecian los libros estaban muy ocupados en revisar todas las obras.
- 2. MÁS LECTORES. Otra señal es que ahorá existe un público consistente para los libros tanto en español como en inglés, de 15.5 millones de lectores en todo Estados Unidos. Estos lectores consistentes representan el 34 por ciento de todos los latinos adultos y cuentan con un ingreso combinado de \$452 mil millones. La encuesta nacional del National Latino Reader Study a 10 mil 640 personas halló que estos lectores compran en promedio 24.7 libros cada año, 42 por ciento de los cuales están en español, un aumento significante comparado con unos años atrás, cuando era mucho más difícil encontrar una gran variedad de libros en español en Estados Unidos.
- 3. CASAS EDITORIALES GRANDES. Otro indicador clave es que las casas editoriales grandes están poniendo más atención en autores latinos prometedores. Estas casas editoriales han sido testigos de un público en aumento para sus libros—y empiezan a comprender mejor cómo hacer mercadotecnia a la comunidad latina.
- 4. MEJOR CALIDAD. Empowering Latino Futures toma muy en serio la responsabilidad que se ha generado en los libros por y para los latinos y en la calidad de las obras. Por eso, además de reconocer cómo sobresalen estos títulos premiados, se celebran los libros con Mención Honorífica. También son obras dignas de leer y disfrutarse.

Desde que se estableció en 1997, Empowering Latino Futures ha realizado 71 Festivales del Libro y la Fámilia alrededor del país; ha servido a 182,500 jóvenes con nuestro Directorio Nacional de Becas para Latinos e Indígenas Americanos; ha honrado más de 3 mil libros mediante los Premios Internacionales de Libros Latinos; ha proporcionado 208 mil libros a jóvenes desatendidos mediante Educación Empieza en el Hogar, el cual arrancó en 2015; y ha honrado 199 libros y guiones mediante los Premios Libros Convertidos en Cine. Por cierto, llevaremos a cabo nuestro 72do Festival Latino del Libro y la Familia en Sacramento City College el 4 de noviembre, con Dolores Huerta como oradora principal.
